

El Agua del Yunque Project: Field Visit Report




Inspection details

- •Río Espíritu Santo
- Quebrada Grande
- •Río Grande Bridge


Summary of Insights

During our visit to the National Forest El Yunque today, we observed a considerable amount of trash and several illegal dumping sites accumulating near the rivers and other recreational areas along scenic Route 186.

The waste along Scenic Route 186 appears to be linked to two main sources: recreational activities and ongoing construction projects, posing a serious threat to the local environment. Waste from recreational activities included plastics, food packaging, beverage bottles (glass and plastic); beverage cans, cups and plates (plastics), grocery bags and other debris left behind by visitors. On the other hand, construction generates small rubbles, orange construction site nest, and other building materials that can end up in natural areas if not properly managed. Additionally, we observed several small illegal dumping

sites with tires and appliances.







Scenic Route 186 - small illegal dumping sites (Km. 21.2 y 21.8)






